C Oppose Citizens United

Corporations are not people and should not be afforded the same democratic rights. Los Angeles should join a growing chorus of 400 cities and states that formally oppose the Supreme Court's decision in Citizens United v. FEC, when the court ruled that corporations have the same rights as individuals to use money as a form of political speech. Los Angeles would be the largest city or state to formally oppose Citizens United, by doing so it would build momentum for a Constitutional amendment overturning the decision.

E Marijuana Dispensaries -Limit & No Tax

The backers of Measure E no longer support it. Initially placed on the ballot by a coalition of medical marijuana advocates and labor unions, they have shifted their support to Proposition D. The two measures are identical other than the tax provision.

Marijuana Dispensaries -Limit & Tax

The consensus proposition endorsed by both mayoral candidates, the Los Angeles City Council, and a coalition of medical marijuana advocates and labor unions. Makes medical marijuana available through a limited number of dispensaries (135) that have complied with previous city regulations, increases regulations, and increases the medical marijuana sales tax by 20 percent.

Marijuana Dispensaries - No Limit & Tax

This proposition is backed by a coalition of dispensaries. It allows an unlimited number of dispensaries to operate legally if they participate in a registration system and maintain certain distances from schools and other sensitive uses. It also increases the city tax on medical marijuana by 20 percent and allows dispensaries to operate nightly until 10 pm.
